A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 2 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to offenses against public order, so as to define certain terms; to provide that a
- 3 person commits defamation when he or she causes an unknowing person wrongfully to be
- 4 identified as the person in an obscene depiction; to provide for penalties; to repeal conflicting
- 5 laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Article 2 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 9 offenses against public order, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 10 "<u>16-11-40.1.</u>
- 11 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- (1) 'Nudity' means a state of undress so as to expose the human male or female genitals,
- pubic area, or buttocks, with or without a translucent covering, or the showing of the
- 14 female breasts, with or without a translucent covering, of any portion thereof below the
- top of the nipple.
- 16 (2) 'Obscene depiction' means a visual depiction of an individual displaying nudity or
- 17 <u>sexual conduct.</u>
- 18 (3) 'Sexual conduct' means actual or simulated acts of masturbation, homosexuality,
- 19 <u>sexual intercourse</u>, or physical contact in an act of apparent sexual stimulation or
- 20 gratification with a person's clothed or unclothed genitals, pubic area, buttocks, or, if such
- 21 <u>person is female, breasts.</u>
- 22 (b) A person commits the offense of defamation if such person intentionally causes an
- 23 <u>unknowing person wrongfully to be identified as the person in an obscene depiction in such</u>
- 24 <u>a manner that a reasonable person would conclude that the image depicted was that of the</u>
- 25 person so wrongfully identified. Such identification shall include, without limitation, a

person's name, address, telephone number, or e-mail address. Such identification shall also include the electronic imposing of the facial image of a person onto an obscene depiction.

(c) Any person convicted of violating subsection (b) of this Code section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$1,000.00 or by imprisonment for not more than one year, or both."
