A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRESPASS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

| 1 | SECTION 1. The legislature finds that visitor guide |
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| 2 | websites and visitor guide publications may inadvertently invite |
| 3 | visitors to trespass onto remote private property to experience |
| 4 | an attraction or activity. The representations made by these |
| 5 | websites and guide publications put visitors at potential risk |
| 6 | by describing attractions or activities without adequately |
| 7 | explaining the inherent dangers associated with them, often |
| 8 | resulting in serious injury or death to the visitor. |
| 9 | The legislature further finds that because of the nature of the |
| 10 | attraction or activity, the private landowner is unable to |
| 11 | reasonably prevent trespassers from going on or through their |
| 12 | land to get to the dangerous attraction or activity. |
| 13 | The purpose of this Act is to: |
| 14 | (1) Hold authors and publishers of visitor guide websites |
| 15 | and visitor guide publications liable to individuals |
| 16 | who suffer injury or death as a result of being |
| 17 | enticed to trespass; and |

| 3 | SECT | ION 2. Chapter 663, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is |

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1 "Visitor guide publication" means any published book, 2 pamphlet, magazine, handout, mailer, or advertisement, whether 3 disseminated via hard copy or electronic distribution that 4 provides information about a visitor destination, geographic 5 destination, or natural attraction on privately owned land in 6 the State. 7 "Visitor guide website" means any commercial travel: (1) Website; 8 (2) Social media wireless communication; 9 10 (3) Forum; 11 (4) Twitter account; or 12 (5) Bloq; 13 that provides information about a visitor destination, 14 geographic destination, or natural attraction on privately owned 15 land in the State." SECTION 3. Section 708-800, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 17 amended by amending the definition of "enter or remain 18 unlawfully" to read as follows: 19 ""Enter or remain unlawfully." A person "enters or remains 20 unlawfully" in or upon premises when the person is not licensed, 21 invited $[\tau]$ by the land owner or lawful occupier of the land, or otherwise privileged to do so. A person who, regardless of the 22



- 1 person's intent, enters or remains in or upon premises [which
- 2 are] that at the time are open to the public does so with
- 3 license and privilege unless the person defies a lawful order
- 4 not to enter or remain, personally communicated to the person by
- 5 the owner of the premises or some other authorized person. A
- 6 license or privilege to enter or remain in a building [which]
- 7 that is only partly open to the public is not a license or
- 8 privilege to enter or remain in that part of the building
- 9 [which] that is not open to the public. [A-person who enters-or
- 10 remains upon unimproved and apparently unused land, which is
- 11 neither fenced nor otherwise enclosed in a manner designed to
- 12 exclude-intruders, does-so-with-license-and-privilege unless
- 13 notice against trespass is personally communicated to the person
- 14 by the owner of the land or some other authorized person, or
- 15 unless notice is given by posting in a conspicuous manner.] "
- 16 SECTION 4. Section 708-814, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended by amending subsection (1) to read as follows:
- 18 "(1) A person commits the offense of criminal trespass in
- 19 the second degree if:
- 20 (a) The person knowingly enters or remains unlawfully in
- or upon premises that are enclosed in a manner
- 22 designed to exclude intruders or are fenced;



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| (b) | The person enters or remains unlawfully in or upon |
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| | commercial premises after a reasonable warning or |
| | request to leave by the owner or lessee of the |
| | commercial premises, the owner's or lessee's |
| | authorized agent, or a police officer; provided that |
| | this paragraph shall not apply to any conduct or |
| | activity subject to regulation by the National Labor |
| | Relations Act. |

For the purposes of this paragraph, "reasonable warning or request" means a warning or request communicated in writing at any time within a one-year period inclusive of the date the incident occurred, which may contain but is not limited to the following information:

(i) A warning statement advising the person that the person's presence is no longer desired on the property for a period of one year from the date of the notice, that a violation of the warning will subject the person to arrest and prosecution for trespassing pursuant to section 708-814(1)(b), and that criminal trespass in the second degree is a petty misdemeanor;

| 9 | and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. |
| 10 | SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. |
