Section 1. Permit to film law enforcement activities -- regulation. (1) A person 12 employed by or for or contracting directly or indirectly with a television or film production company may not 13 accompany and film for distribution a law enforcement officer conducting official duties on private property unless 14 the person or the television or film production company has obtained from the department of commerce a permit 15 to film law enforcement activities. 16 (2) An application for a permit to film law enforcement activities must be made on a form prescribed by 17 the department of commerce. A person or television or film production company shall obtain a permit for each 18 law enforcement agency whose officer the person or company will accompany and film. 19 (3) A permit must be issued upon application and payment of a \$100 fee. A permit is valid for 6 months. 20 (4) A permit issued under this section does not obligate a law enforcement agency to allow a law 21 enforcement officer to be accompanied and filmed during conduct of official duties on private property. A law 22 enforcement agency that allows a law enforcement officer to be accompanied and filmed retains full control over 23 the content of any recording and must approve its use and any edited version of the content before the content 24 or edited content may be aired. 25 (5) A person or television or film production company that obtains a permit pursuant to this section shall 26 obtain a release waiver from any person who is filmed interacting with a law enforcement officer. 27 (6) A person or television or film production company that violates this section is subject to a civil penalty 28 of \$500.
