21	SECTION 1. Chapter 75, Title 15 of the 1976 Code is amended by

24	"Section 15-75-70. (A) A person may be liable in a civil action
25	for damages arising from the malicious publication of photographs
26	or other similar images on a website accessible by the public
27	including, but not limited to, a social media website if he intends to
28	harm the person's character or reputation and such harm to the
29	person's character or reputation is proven by a preponderance of the
30	evidence.
31	(B) As used in this section, the term:
32	(1) 'Malicious' means an action taken with actual malice
33	aforethought.
34	(2) 'Photograph' includes all photographs, including those
35	which are unaltered, retouched, or otherwise edited.
36	(3) 'Publication' means the dissemination of the photograph
37	without the knowledge or consent of the party in the photograph.
38	(4) 'Social Media' means a category of Internet sites based on
39	user participation and user-generated content centered on user
40	interaction."
41 42	SECTION 2. This act takes effect upon approval by the Governor.
