9 10	This bill imposes booking photograph removal and destruction requirements on certain publications and websites that publish and post booking photographs.

16	destruction within certain time periods;

19	of a fee depending on the disposition of the related criminal charge; or
20	C conditioning removal and destruction of a booking photograph on the payment
21	of a fee above a certain amount in certain circumstances;
22	< for a booking photograph publication or website that does not comply with a
23	requirement to remove and destroy a booking photograph:
24	C allows for the imposition of a civil penalty; and
25	C provides for liability for certain legal costs; and
